* Chapter VIII can be considered only as a later edition to Xenophon's work — a bit of historical criticism in a review accompanying the book reviewed. It spoils the perfect unity of the work up to this chapter : Cyrus is born, grows to manhood, completes his conquests, establishes his kingdom, organizes the various departments of his empire, dies. Some violent opponent of Medic influence in Athens could not leave all this glorification of Persian institutions unchallenged, and so in this appendix he has supplied an account of the degeneracy of the descendants of the virtuous Persians of the earlier day.

The chapter is included here in accord with all the manuscripts and editions. But the reader is recommended to close the book at this point and read no further. [This early example of political correctness (PC) is so offensive that I will follow the advice tendered — PC is rampant in late 20th and early 21st century America, obviously so.]
